- bus: a large vehicle for transporting people. "The bus stopped at the corner."
- bit: a small piece or amount. "She ate a bit of cake."
- bar: a long, rigid piece of metal or wood. "He lifted the bar with ease."
- bow: a weapon for shooting arrows. "He aimed the bow at the target."
- box: a container with flat sides. "She opened the box."
- bid: to offer a price. "He bid on the antique vase."

- bleak: offering little or no hope; cold and piercing. "The future seemed bleak."
- blithe: acting without thought or regard. "His blithe disregard for the rules was troubling."

- build: to construct by assembling parts. "They will build a new house."
- bounce: to spring back after hitting a surface. "When the kids play wall ball, they bounce the ball off a wall."
- breathe: to take air into the lungs and then expel it. "She took a moment to breathe deeply."
- browse: to look through or glance at casually. "Let's browse the bookstore for a new novel."
- bargain: to negotiate the terms and conditions of a transaction. "Sally got the pants for a bargain since they were on sale."
- behave: to act in a certain way. "The children behave well at school."
- believe: to accept something as true. "I believe in your potential."
- blink: to shut and open the eyes quickly. "The bright sun causes me to blink and squint a lot."
- blush: to turn red in the face from embarrassment or emotion. "Receiving a compliment made him blush."
- boil: to heat a liquid until it bubbles and begins to turn to steam. "She waited for the water to boil."
- borrow: to use something that belongs to someone else with the intention of returning it. "Can I borrow your pen?"
- brake: to cause a vehicle to slow down or stop. "He needed to brake suddenly to avoid the cat."
- bury: to put into the ground and cover up. "Let's bury the time capsule in the yard."
