- fan: a device that cools the air. "The fan keeps the room cool."
- fed: past tense of feed, to give food. "She fed the dog."
- fib: a small lie. "It's dishonest to tell a fib."
- fig: a type of sweet fruit. "She enjoyed eating a fig."
- fin: the end part of a fish that helps it swim. "The fish uses its fin to move through the water."
- fit: to be the right size or shape. "The shoe will fit her foot."
- fix: to repair something. "He will fix the broken toy."
- fob: a small object attached to a keychain. "He has a fob for his keys."
- fog: a low-lying cloud. "The morning fog was thick."
- for: used to indicate the use of something. "A fork is used for eating."
- fun: enjoyable or amusing. "Playing the game is a lot of fun."
- fur: the hair on an animal. "The cat's fur is soft."

- find: to discover by searching. "Can you find your toy?"
- fire: a process of burning. "The fire is warm."
- five: the number after four. "She is five years old."
- flap: to move up and down. "The bird will flap its wings."
- flip: to turn over quickly. "She will flip the page."
- flower: a colorful part of a plant. "She picked a flower from the garden."
- flow: to move along steadily and continuously. "The river will flow to the sea."
- flu: short for influenza, a viral infection. "He caught the flu."
- food: what people and animals eat. "She likes healthy food."
- foot: the part of the body used for walking. "She hurt her foot."
- fork: a tool for eating. "He eats with a fork."
- forklift: a vehicle for lifting heavy things. "The forklift moved the boxes."
- four: the number after three. "He has four apples."
- free: not costing anything. "The candy is free for children to take while trick-or-treating."
- freedom: the right to act, speak, or think as one wants. "We cherish our freedom."
- freeze: to turn to ice. "Water will freeze at 0 degrees."
- frown: to show unhappiness with your face. "People often frown when feeling sad."
- fruit: the sweet, edible product of a tree or plant. "She eats fruit every day."
- full: completely filled; containing all that can be held. "The glass is full of water."

- foil: a very thin sheet of metal. "She wrapped the sandwich in foil."
- fold: to bend something over on itself. "Please fold your clothing and put it away."
- fond: having a liking or affection for. "She is fond of chocolate."
- font: a specific size and style of text. "They chose a new font for the document."
