CVC Words

- pad: a piece of soft material used as a cushion. "She placed a pad on the hard seat."
- pal: a friend. "He went to the park with his pal."
- pan: a metal container used for cooking. "She fried eggs in the pan."
- pat: to touch gently with a flat hand. "She gave the dog a pat on the head."
- pet: an animal kept for companionship. "He has a pet cat."
- pin: a small, thin piece of metal used for fastening. "She used a pin to hold the fabric together."
- pit: a large hole in the ground. "They dug a pit for the campfire."
- pod: a long, thin part of some plants that contains seeds. "They picked peas from the pod."
- pot: a container used for cooking. "She cooked soup in the large pot."
- pup: a young dog. "The pup played with a ball."

- page: one side of a sheet of paper. "She read a page from her book."
- pair: two things that are similar and meant to be used together. "She bought a new pair of shoes."
- park: a large public green area. "They had a picnic in the park."

- pear: a sweet fruit with a rounded shape and thin skin. "She ate a ripe pear."
- peel: to remove the outer layer. "He began to peel the orange."
- pen: a tool for writing with ink. "She signed her name with a pen."

- pink: a color that is a lighter, pastel shade of red. "The kids played with a pink beach ball."
- pig: a farm animal with a snout and a curly tail. "The pig rolled in the mud."

Kindergarten Words

- palace: a large and impressive home of a ruler or an important person. "The king lived in a grand palace."
- panic: a sudden feeling of fear that you cannot control. "She felt panic when she lost her way."
- parcel: a package or bundle of items. "The mailman delivered a parcel."
- pardon: the action of forgiving or being forgiven. "He asked for a pardon."
- parrot: a colorful bird known for its ability to mimic sounds. "The parrot said 'hello' from its cage."
- pastel: a soft and delicate shade of a color. "She painted the room pastel blue."
- pebble: a small, smooth stone. "She collected a pebble from the beach."
- pedal: a lever pressed by the foot in a machine. "He pushed the pedal on his bike."
- pirate: a person who robs or commits illegal acts at sea. "They dressed as a pirate for Halloween."

- parade: a public procession celebrating a special day or event. "They watched the parade on Main Street."
- patient: able to accept or tolerate delays, problems, or suffering without becoming annoyed or anxious. "She was patient with the slow service."
- pattern: a repeated decorative design. "She liked the floral pattern on the dress."

- perfect: having all the required or desirable elements, qualities, or characteristics. "Her height made her perfect for organizing the tall shelves."
- perform: to carry out an action or task. "He will perform in the school play."
- photograph: a picture made using a camera. "She took a photograph of the sunset."
- picnic: an outing or occasion that involves taking a packed meal to be eaten outdoors. "They went for a picnic in the park."
- polite: showing good manners towards others. "He was polite to everyone he met."

Food words

- pancake: a thin, flat cake that's often eaten for breakfast. "She made pancakes with blueberries in them."
- papaya: a tropical fruit with orange flesh. "He enjoyed a slice of papaya."
- pasta: a food originally from Italy made from durum wheat and water that comes in various shapes. "They had pasta with vegetables for dinner."
- peach: a round, juicy fruit with fuzzy skin. "She ate a peach for snack."
- peanut: a plant with seeds that are often roasted and eaten. "He spread peanut butter on his toast."
- pear: a sweet fruit with a thin skin and soft flesh. "She packed a pear in her lunch."
- pepper: a vegetable that can be spicy. "He added fresh sliced pepper to his salad."
- pie: a baked dish of fruit or meat and vegetables, typically with a top and base of pastry. "They baked an apple pie."
- pineapple: a large tropical fruit with rough, spiky skin and a sweet yellow interior. "She cut the pineapple into cubes for dessert."
- pizza: a dough topped with sauce, cheese, and variety of vegetables and meat. "The children enjoyed eating pizza at the birthday party."
- plum: a small, round fruit with a smooth skin and sweet flesh. "He picked a plum from the tree and ate it."

Object words

- palette: a board used by artists to mix colors. "She arranged the paints on her palette."

- pyramid: a large structure with a square or triangular base and sloping sides that meet in a point at the top. "They visited the ancient pyramid in Egypt."

Places Words

- park: a large public green area in a town, used for recreation. "They walked their dog in the park."
- parkway: a wide road with a dividing strip of grass, trees, or flowers. "They drove along the parkway."
- pier: a structure leading out from the shore into the water, used as a place for ships to dock or people to walk. "They fished from the pier."
- plaza: an open area in towns or cities with shops, walkways, and plantings. "They met at the plaza for coffee."
- port: a town or city with a harbor where ships load or unload. "The port was busy with cargo ships."
- prairie: a large open area of grassland. "They saw bison on the prairie."

- peak: the pointed top of a mountain. "They climbed to the peak of the mountain."

- plateau: an area of high, flat land. "They hiked across the plateau."
- pond: a small body of still water. "They fed the ducks at the pond."

- precipice: a very steep rock face or cliff. "They stood at the edge of the precipice and looked down."
- puddle: a small pool of water, usually from rain. "He jumped over the puddle."
- pulse: the number of times a heart beats in a certain time period, usually a minute. "She felt her pulse after running."
- pyrite: a shiny yellow mineral also known as fool's gold. "He found a piece of pyrite in the mine."

- peaceful: free from disturbance; tranquil. "The garden was a peaceful place to relax."
- persistent: continuing to try to do something even if it's difficult or others tell you to stop. "She was persistent in her studies."
- playful: fond of games and amusement; lighthearted. "The kitten was very playful."
- pleasant: giving a sense of happy satisfaction or enjoyment. "The weather was pleasant."
- proud: feeling satisfaction from an achievement. "She was proud of winning her tennis match."
- puzzled: unable to understand; perplexed. "He looked puzzled at the strange instructions."

- paint: to cover a surface with paint. "They decided to paint the fence."
- park: to bring a vehicle to a halt and leave it temporarily. "They will park the car near the store."
- paste: to stick something to something else with glue. "She used glue to paste the picture in her scrapbook."
