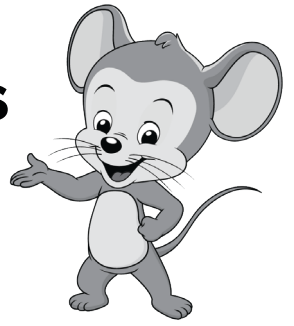


# Letter V Vocabulary Words

## with Definitions and Example Sentences



### CVC Words

- van: a type of vehicle that's larger and used for transporting goods or people. "They loaded the van with supplies for their restaurant."
- vat: a large container used for holding liquids. "The slime was mixed together in a large vat."
- vet: abbreviation of the word 'veterinarian;' a doctor for animals. "She took her dog to the vet for a checkup."
- vex: to annoy or frustrate someone. "The constant noise began to vex him."
- vow: a solemn promise. "They made a vow to be honest with each other."

### Simple Preschool Words

- vase: a container used to hold flowers. "She put fresh flowers in the vase."
- vent: an opening that allows air, gas, or liquid to pass out of or into a space. "The kitchen has a vent to remove heat and smells from cooking."
- very: a lot. "The weather is very hot today."
- vest: a sleeveless garment worn over a shirt. "He wore a vest with his suit."

## Kindergarten Words

- vast: very large in size or amount. “The desert is vast and filled with sand.”
- veil: a piece of fine material worn to cover the face. “The bride wore a veil over her face on her wedding day.”
- verse: a line of poetry or a section of a song. “She wrote a verse for the song.”
- view: the ability to see something. “The view from the mountain is spectacular.”
- visit: to go and spend time with someone. “They went to visit their grandparents.”
- voice: the sound that people make when they speak or sing. “Her voice is very calming to hear.”

## Elementary Words

- vacation: a period of time for rest and relaxation. “They went on vacation to the beach.”
- valid: based on truth or reason. “His argument was valid and well researched.”
- value: the importance or worth of something. “He taught them the value of working hard.”
- various: different kinds. “The store sells various types of candy.”
- vein: a tube in the body that carries blood to the heart. “The doctor examined the vein in his arm.”
- vendor: a person or company offering something for sale. “The vendor sold fresh fruits at the market.”
- verdict: a decision made by a judge or jury during a court case. “The jury delivered a guilty verdict.”
- version: a form of something that’s been changed or updated from an earlier form. “He downloaded the latest version of the software.”
- vessel: a ship or large boat. “The vessel sailed across the ocean.”
- victory: an act of defeating an opponent. “They celebrated their victory in the volleyball game.”
- village: a small community or group of houses. “They live in a quiet village.”
- villain: the bad person in a story or movie; a criminal. “The movie was about a villain getting caught for their crimes.”

## Food Words

- vanilla: a flavoring of food that comes from a vanilla plant and is often used in desserts. “She added vanilla to the cake batter.”
- vegetable: a plant or part of a plant used as food. “She loves to eat the vegetables grown in her garden.”
- vermicelli: a type of pasta similar to spaghetti. “She made a vermicelli dish with tomato sauce.”
- vichyssoise: a thick, creamy soup made of potatoes, leeks, and cream. “They served vichyssoise as a starter.”
- vinegar: a sour liquid used for seasoning or preserving food. “She used vinegar in the salad dressing.”
- vinaigrette: a dressing made from oil and vinegar. “The salad was served with a light vinaigrette.”

## Animal Words

- vaquita: a rare species of porpoise found in the Gulf of California. “The vaquita is critically endangered.”
- vervet: a small African monkey. “The vervet monkey swung from tree to tree.”
- vicuña: a wild South American animal, similar to a llama. “The vicuña roamed the high Andes.”
- viper: a venomous snake. “The viper enjoyed warming itself in the sun.”
- viperfish: a deep-sea fish with long, fang-like teeth. “The viperfish glows in the dark ocean depths.”
- vireo: a small songbird. “The vireo sang a cheerful tune.”
- vizsla: a breed of dog with reddish-golden fur originating in Hungary. “The vizsla is known for its hunting skills.”
- vole: a small rodent similar to a mouse. “The vole burrowed into the ground.”
- vulture: a large bird of prey that scavenges for food. “The vulture circled high above.”

## Object Words

- vacuum: a tool that's pushed across the floor to remove dirt. "The vacuum cleaner picked up all the dirt in the hall."
- valve: a device that controls the flow of a fluid. "The plumber fixed the valve under the sink."
- vehicle: something used for transporting people or goods. "They bought a new vehicle."
- violin: a string instrument played with a bow. "She learned to play the violin."
- visor: a stiff brim at the front of a cap. "He wore a visor to keep the sun out of his eyes."

## Places Words

- valley: a low area of land between hills or mountains. "The river flowed through the valley."
- vault: a secure room where valuables are stored. "The bank kept the money in a vault."
- venue: the location where an event takes place. "The concert was held at a large venue."
- viaduct: a long bridge-like structure, typically a series of arches. "The train crossed the viaduct."
- villa: a large and luxurious country house. "They rented a villa in Italy for their vacation."
- volcano: a mountain or hill with a crater that can erupt with lava. "The volcano erupted with great force."

## Nature and Environment Words

- vapor: a substance diffused or suspended in the air. “Water vapor condensed on the windows.”
- veld: open grassy land primarily in southern Africa. “The animals grazed on the veld.”
- vine: a climbing or trailing plant. “The vine grew along the fence.”
- vortex: a mass of whirling fluid or air. “The tornado formed a vortex of wind.”

## Emotions and Trait Words

- valiant: showing bravery or determination. “The firefighter made a valiant effort to get the cat out of the tree.”
- valuable: worth a great deal of money or importance. “Her necklace is very valuable.”
- vehement: showing strong and passionate feelings. “She was vehement in her argument that cookies are the best dessert.”
- vengeful: wanting revenge. “The character in the story felt vengeful and wanted to get back at the villain.”
- vibrant: full of energy and enthusiasm. “The city is vibrant with life.”
- vigilant: keeping careful watch for possible danger. “The guard remained vigilant throughout the night.”
- virtuous: having high moral standards. “She is known for her virtuous character.”
- vivacious: lively and animated. “Her vivacious personality made her the life of the party.”
- volatile: likely to change quickly and unexpectedly. “The weather was volatile, changing quickly from sunny to stormy.”

## Action Words

- vacate: to leave a place. “They had to vacate the camping spot before the storm arrived.”
- vanish: to disappear suddenly. “The magician made the rabbit vanish.”
- vary: to differ in size, amount, or degree. “The prices vary depending on the season.”
- venture: to undertake a risky or daring journey. “They decided to venture into the unknown forest.”
- ventilate: to cause air to enter and circulate freely. “They ventilate the bathroom with a fan in the ceiling.”
- verify: to make sure something is true. “He needed to verify the facts before publishing the article.”
- visualize: to form a mental image of something. “She tried to visualize her seeing her best friend again soon.”
- volunteer: to offer to do something without being paid. “They decided to volunteer at the local animal shelter.”
- vote: to make a choice in an election. “They went to vote for the new president.”
